- 3) Board member compensation will be \$25 per meeting and special meetings with mileage at the current state rate
- 4) Travel rates will be equal to approved state rates (mileage \$.37/mile, or \$.20 if personal vehicle is used when district vehicle is available and appropriate.)
- 5) Meal reimbursement for travel be at state rates only when overnight travel is required.
